Thank you for your interest in building a Public Access Defibrillation Program at your site. Cardiac arrest is one of the most prevalent causes of death in the population today. The "Chain of Survival" can be a lifesaver to victims of this disease.

Prior to beginning the program approval process, you must first retain the services of a registered PAD program Medical Director (*prescribing physician*) or a physician who is willing to become registered. The program coordinator and the medical director will collaborate in the development of the following:

- Training Standards
- Medical Protocols and Policies
- ❖ How to access the local 911 response system
- Identifying those in need of an AED
- ❖ When to discontinue use of the AED
- Quality Review and Monitoring (100% case review)
- Operations Standards
- Location of AEDs
- Periodic maintenance and equipment evaluation

(Please review the attached state statute and regulations for a full description of the requirements)

The next step is to complete the "Request for a Public Access Defibrillation Program Approval" form. Once this form is submitted with the appropriate documentation, the EMS Agency will review the request and advise the program coordinator on its decision.

You may begin training and implementation of your program once you have received a letter of approval from the EMS Agency.

#### Understanding the Legal Requirements

The prescribing physician is responsible and accountable for assuring the legal requirements for a PAD program are met and maintained. Please review the attached copies of the California Code of Regulations, Title 22 §100031- §100041 and § 1797.196 of the Health and Safety Code. In general, the requirements are as follows:

- These requirements only apply to personnel who are otherwise not licensed or certified at any level of pre-hospital care provider including public safety personnel.
- The provision of medical control including: policies regarding usage of the AED, compliance with Santa Clara County EMS Agency Policies, training and testing procedures, case-by-case review process and specific policies that denote the conditions for the rescission or termination of authorization to use an AED.
- Testing and training procedures that assure the continued competency of authorized individuals, which will include an annual skills proficiency testing.
- ❖ Assure complete documentation of all uses of the AED.

22	(a) Any physician and surgeon licensed in California may authorize an individual
23	to apply and operate an AED on an unconscious person who has no signs of
24	circulation only if that authorized individual has been successfully trained

36	(a) The AED training component shall comply with the American Heart
37	Association or American Red Cross standards. The course shall consist of not
88	less than four hours, which shall include the following topics and skills:

- 15 (8) rapid, accurate assessment of the patient's post-shock status to determine if further activation of the AED is necessary; and,
- 17 (9) authorized individual's responsibility for continuation of care, such as the
- 18 repeated shocks if necessary, and/or accompaniment to the hospital, if indicated,
- 19 or until the arrival of more medically qualified personnel.
- 20 (b) The required hours for an AED training program can be reduced by no more
- than two hours for students who can show they have been certified in a basic
- 22 CPR course in the past year and demonstrate to a qualified CPR instructor that 23 they are proficient in the current techniques of CPR.

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#### § 100039. Medical Director Requirements

- 29 Any AED training course for non-licensed or non-certified personnel shall have a 30 physician medical director who:

- 33 AED instructor standards established by the American Heart Association or the
- 34 American Red Cross and ensure that instructors are trained to the course

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### § 100041. Written Validation.

The prescribing physician shall issue to the authorized individual a written 6 validation or other documented proof of the authorized individual's ability to use

an AED. The requirements for a "Written Validation" and "Prescription for Use"

9 can both be satisfied by the issuance of a written certification card from an AED 10

training program. The prescribing physician's signature shall be on file with the

AED training program authorizing the issuance of the written certification card 11 12 upon successful completion of the required training.

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### Article 4. Operational AED Service Provider/Vendor Requirements

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#### §100042. Operational Requirements.

- (a) An AED Service Provider shall ensure their internal AED programs include all of the following:
- (1) Development of an Internal Emergency Response System which complies with the regulations contained in this Chapter.
- (2) Notification of the local EMS agency of the existence, location and type of 24 AED at the time it is acquired.
- (3) That all applicable local EMS policies and procedures are followed. 26
  - (4) That expected AED users complete a training course in CPR and AED use
  - that complies with requirements of this chapter and the standards of the
- 29 American Heart Association or the American Red Cross.
- (5) That the defibrillator is maintained and regularly tested according to the 30
- 31 operation and maintenance guidelines set forth by the manufacturer, and
- 32 according to any applicable rules and regulations set forth by the governmental
- 33 authority under the federal Food and Drug Administration and any other 34 applicable state and federal authority.
- 35 (6) That the defibrillator is checked for readiness after each use and at least once every 30 days if the AED has not been used in the previous 30 days. Records of 36
- 37 these periodic checks shall be maintained.
- (7) That a mechanism exists to ensure that any person, either an employee or 38
- agent of the AED service provider, or member of the general public who renders 39
- emergency care or treatment on a person in cardiac arrest by using the service 40
- 41 provider's AED activates the emergency medical services system as soon as
- 42 possible, and reports any use of the AED to the local EMS agency.
- (8) That there is involvement of a California licensed physician and surgeon in 43
- 44 developing an Internal Emergency Response System and to ensure compliance
- 45 with these regulations and requirements for training, notification and
- 46 maintenance.

- 2 authorized individuals in the AED Service Provider's employ to include periodic
- 3 training and skills proficiency demonstrations.
